

# How YOU can Participate in the Section 106 Process


The Section 106 Process encourages consultation and public participation. Consulting parties in the process include:

- Federal agencies—Federal Highway Administration
- State Historic Preservation Office
- Representatives of local governments with jurisdiction over the area with historic properties
- Applicants for federal funds—MoDOT
- Additional consulting parties include those with a *demonstrated interest* in the undertaking due to their legal or economic relation to the project or property OR the projects effects on historic properties.



To request consulting party status organizations can send a letter explaining their interest in the project or historic property to the MoDOT Historic Preservation Section.

Consultation occurs at key stages of the project including the identification of properties eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, the assessment of effects on those properties, and resolution of adverse effects.



The public can be involved in the Section 106 process by expressing concerns at public meetings including attending and submitting comments. Members of the public can also work with consulting parties to make sure that their views are being represented.
