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Hochtief Joins Team United

JEFFERSON CITY – Hochtief, an international construction services provider based in Essen, Germany, has joined Team United in its effort to win the Missouri Department of Transportation’s “Safe & Sound Bridge Improvement Program” contract.

Hochtief will join with John Laing Infrastructure atop Team United’s major participant structure. Other major participants include design-builders United Contractors, Flatiron Constructors, Cramer/United/Jensen JV and LPA Group (engineering), Roy Jorgensen & Associates (maintenance) and RBC Capital Markets (finance).

Last month, Hochtief acquired Flatiron Construction Corp. from the Royal BAM Group based in the Netherlands.

Technical proposals for MoDOT’s Safe & Sound program, which will improve 802 of Missouri’s lowest rated bridges by the end of 2012, are due on October 25.
