

Lemay Ferry Road Sidewalk Project



**A project to replace the sidewalk on the east side of Lemay Ferry Road
(Lindbergh to south of Buckley Road)**

What Is The Problem?

The existing Lemay Ferry Road was designed with a raised shoulder for vehicles to have refuge in the event of a car trouble or an emergency. The raised shoulder is being used as a sidewalk, however, it is narrow, is void of wheelchair ramps, is inconsistent and ends/ starts suddenly, and the existing asphalt surface is pitted and crumbling.

What Is The Proposed Solution?

MoDOT is designing a project to replace the east side of the Lemay Ferry Road sidewalk from Lindbergh to south of Buckley. The new sidewalk will be 6 feet wide and constructed of concrete. Additionally, pedestrian push buttons will be added to the traffic signals, obstructions in the walkway will be reduced to a minimum, islands will be modified for wheelchair access, and ramps will be constructed at the entrances making Lemay Ferry Road more ADA accessible and pedestrian friendly.

Estimated Project Cost:

- Estimated cost to replace the east side of Lemay Ferry Road sidewalk from Lindbergh to south of Buckley is: **\$1 million**

Current Project Timeline

May 17th, 2011	Public meeting at Urgent Care on Lemay Ferry Road.
September 2011	MoDOT expects the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission to award the contract to low bidder.
October 2011	Construction could begin.
